

Dino Bone

Materials

- Cardboard tube (gift wrap or a paper towel tube will do)
- Large bowl and something to stir with
- Water and flour 250 ml (one cup) each
- Newspaper
- Tape
- White, yellow and/or light brown paint
- Paint brush

Procedure

1. Crumble newspaper into balls and tape to the ends of the tube. You may want to wrap the paper tube in tape to prevent the tube from becoming soggy and falling apart.



2. Make a thin glue from flour and water. Take 250 ml (one cup) water and 250 ml (one cup) flour and mix together until runny.



3. Then stir in an extra 1 litre (4 cups) of boiling water. Simmer for 4 minutes and let cool. The mixture should be about the consistency of porridge.



4. Tear many strips of newspaper and/or brown paper bag. Strips should be approximately 2.5 cm (1 in) wide; the length of the strips is not important.

5. Dip the paper strip into the glue mixture and then wrap it around your "bone." Continue until the entire bone is covered and has your desired shape. Let it dry for 24 hours or longer if the bone is not yet dry.



6. Paint your bone.
