

Dino Egg

Materials

- One balloon for each egg
- Newspaper and/or brown paper bags
- Flour and water glue mixture (directions below)
- Paints and markers
- Small toy dinosaur

Procedure

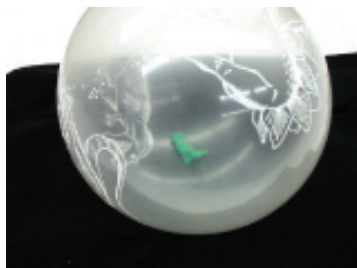
1. Make a thin glue from flour and water. Take 250 ml (one cup) water and 250 ml (one cup) flour and mix together until runny.



2. Then stir in an extra 1 litre (4 cups) of boiling water. Simmer for 4 minutes and let cool. The mixture should be the consistency of porridge.



3. Tear strips of newspaper and/or brown paper bag. Strips should be approximately 2.5 cm (one in) wide; the length of the strips is not important.
4. For a more exciting dinosaur egg, put a small toy dinosaur inside the balloon before blowing it up.



5. Dip each strip of paper in the glue mixture and wrap it around the balloon. Make at least two layers around the balloon.
6. Let the dinosaur egg dry overnight or until the egg is completely dry. When it is dry, pop and remove the balloon from inside the egg.
7. After the dinosaur egg is dry, decorate with markers or paint.



8. Later you can "hatch" your egg to reveal the toy dinosaur.
