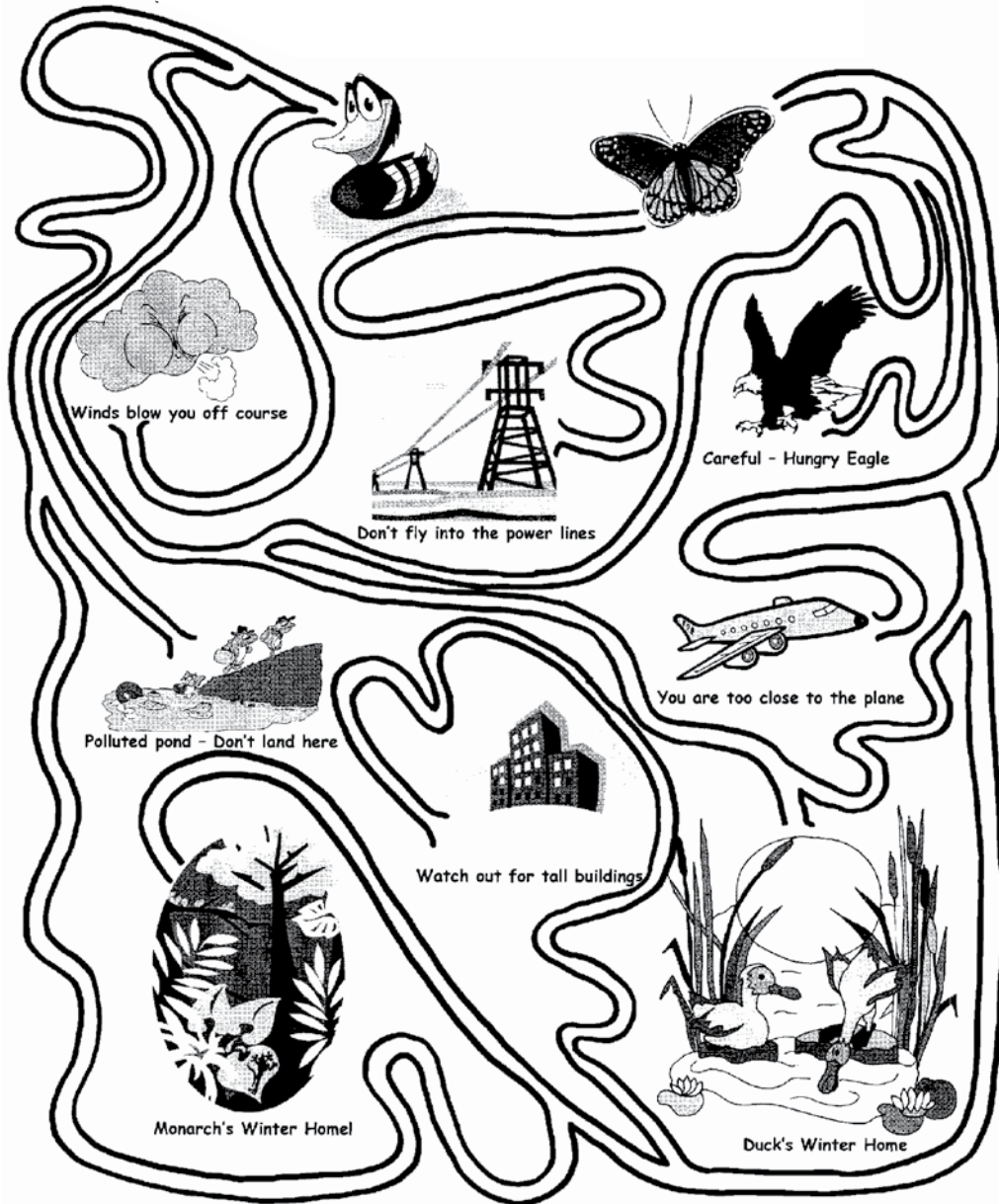


MIGRATION MAZE

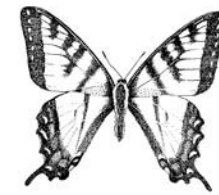
2) At the *Bogs, Fens, and Muskegs* display, get down on your hands and knees. How many beetles do you see?
